MEMORANDUM FOR All Carlisle Barracks Personnel

SUBJECT: Garrison Commander's Curfew Policy

1. This memorandum sets forth local policies and procedures regulating and restricting the activities of juveniles during the below listed times periods. The primary purpose of this curfew is to reduce juvenile misconduct within the Carlisle Barracks community and protect juveniles from unlawful activities and from becoming prey to criminals. This policy also serves to strengthen parental responsibilities and empowers Department of the Army (DA) Police to enforce curfew violations.

2. Curfew ages and times.

a. Children 13 years of age and younger will be inside their own or someone else's on-post quarters between 2100 and 0600 unless they are under the direct supervision of a parent, guardian, or Family member 18 years of age or older.

b. Children 14 and 15 years of age will be inside their own or someone else's on-post quarters between 2200 and 0530 unless they are under the direct supervision of a parent, guardian, or Family member 18 years of age or older.

c. Children 16 and 17 years of age will be inside their own or someone else's on-post quarters between 2300 and 0530 unless they are under the direct supervision of a parent, guardian or Family member 18 years of age or older.

3. Violations of the Curfew Policy.

a. When a juvenile is discovered outside of quarters without proper supervision as stated in paragraph 2.a., b., and c. of this policy, the juvenile shall be considered in violation of curfew and the following shall apply:

(1) First Offense: The juvenile will be fully identified by the DA Police. An inquiry will be made to determine what the juvenile is doing out past curfew. If no other illegal or unauthorized activity is discovered, the juvenile will be instructed to return to his/her quarters or the quarters of the individual he/she may be visiting.

(2) Second Offense: The juvenile will be fully identified by the DA Police. Once

the determination is made that this is the juvenile's second offense (prior instances of curfew violation will be track by the DA Police), the purpose for the violation will be determined. The juvenile will then be sent back to his/her quarters or the quarters of the person he/she may be visiting. The DA Police will contact the juvenile's sponsor/guardian to inform of the curfew violation and warn that future violations will lead to the citation of the sponsor/guardian.

(3) Third and Subsequent Offenses: The juvenile will be fully identified by the DA Police and transported to the Carlisle Barracks Police Department (CBPD). The sponsor/guardian will be contacted and required to report to the CBPD. The sponsor/guardian will be cited on a DD Form 1408 for "Failure to Obey an Order or Regulation" in violation of this Curfew Policy.

b. Additionally, military sponsors may be subjected to adverse administrative action or face non-judicial or judicial punishment under Article 92, UCMJ. Civilians or dependents (juveniles or adults) that repeatedly violate this policy may be permanently barred from entering Carlisle Barracks by the Garrison Commander or lose their eligibility to live in post housing.
